EXECUTIVE ORDER 2025-193

AMENDING AND RESCINDING EXECUTIVE ORDERS

WHEREAS, as Governor of the State of New Mexico, I have the authority to issue executive orders to address emergencies, implement policy, and ensure the effective administration of state government;

WHEREAS, various executive orders were issued to declare emergencies and unlock emergency funding in response to specific circumstances, and those emergencies have since been resolved;


WHEREAS, other executive orders were issued to address temporary needs, implement short-term policies, or direct state agencies in ways that are no longer necessary or beneficial; and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of good governance, efficiency, and clarity to amend or rescind executive orders that are obsolete, unnecessary, or no longer serve a current purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Michelle Lujan Grisham, Governor of the State of New Mexico, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of the State of New Mexico do hereby **RESCIND** Executive Orders 2011-001, 2011-002, 2011-031, 2011-071, 2011-079, 2011-080, 2012-002, 2012-003, 2012-023, 2012-033, 2013-005, 2014-001, 2014-002, 2016-037, 2017-002, 2018-008, 2018-055, 2019-008, 2019-009, 2019-014, 2019-016, 2020-040, 2020-066, 2021-028, 2021-047, 2021-048, 2021-056, 2022-022, and 2023-060, as well as any Executive

Orders necessitated by the COVID-19 pandemic that were not rescinded by operation of Executive Order 2023-036. I further **ORDER** that all orders declaring a state of emergency and releasing emergency funds, including those issued by previous Governors, shall be deemed to expire once their authorized funds are expended or no longer necessary to provide emergency assistance.


